Transportation Education Academy Activities

K-6: Air, Land, Water, Multi-Modal



Snowplows (Land)

LENGTH: One hour

CURRICULUM: Writing, Safety (Health), Art

OBJECTIVES: Student will identify the snowplow as a form of land transportation. The importance of safe driv-

ing near a snowplow will be stressed. **EDUCATIONAL LEVEL**: Grades 3 - 4

MATERIALS:

- 1. Video "Anatomy of a Snowplow" (10 minutes)
- **2.** Snowplow and driver (provided by Mn/DOT)
- 3. paper
- 4. pencils

PROCEDURE:

- **1.** As winter approaches, discuss the snowplow and its purposes. Have students formulate questions about the snowplow and its job. Write the questions on a piece of paper.
- 2. Contact MN/DOT prior to the lesson and have a snowplow and driver come to the school for observation.
- **3.** Observe the plow and the inside of the cab. Discuss the purpose and safety precautions necessary. Students may generate more questions.
- 4. Watch the video "Anatomy of a snowplow".
- **5.** With the students in groups of four, have them list the things they learned about the snowplow and safety issues involved.
- **6.** As an extension, groups of students could create a winter mural (including a snowplow) to decorate the hallway using 3' x 8' pieces of bulletin board paper. A safety message could be included on the mural.

POINTS TO DISCUSS:

- 1. What would happen if we did not have snowplows?
- **2.** Why is it important to drive cautiously when near a snowplow?
- **3.** How does the salt that is used on highways to to clear them of ice and snow affect the vegetation and waterways?
