FLY CLEAR OF WILDFIRES AND SMOKE

- Check NOTAMs for temporary flight restrictions.
- General aviation pilots are asked to stay seven miles away from and 5,000 feet above all fires!
- Even if no fire fighting aircraft are visible, general aviators should assume they are in the airspace around a fire.
- Wildland fire aviators fly in less than ideal conditions; congested airspace, smoke, strong winds, power lines and radio towers. When you combine these conditions with general aviators flying to “check out the fire”, the results could easily be disastrous.
