

Advisory Council on Connected and Automated Vehicles *Public Meetings: Your Opportunity to Create State Policy*

Overview

<u>Executive Order 18-04</u> established the Governor's Advisory Council on Connected and Automated Vehicles (CAV). The Advisory Council, in collaboration with partners and the public, will prepare recommended changes to statutes, rules, and policies to the Governor and Legislature by December 1, 2018.

These recommendations will focus on eight topic areas, including: (1) transportation infrastructure; (2) cyber security and data privacy; (3) vehicle registration, driver training, licensing; (4) insurance and liability; (5) traffic regulations and safety; (6) economic development, business opportunity, and workforce preparation; (7) land use and planning; and (8) ensuring accessibility and equity for all Minnesotans including rural Minnesota, the elderly, people with disabilities, low-income communities, communities of color, and inter-governmental discussions with American Indian Tribal Governments.

Public Meetings & Participation

Through facilitated sessions involving state liaisons, key experts and the public, participants will share their expertise, ideas, and feedback on how CAV technology will impact the lives of Minnesotans. Each subcommittee will meet approximately two to four times to share their knowledge, ideas, and feedback. Participants will provide the Advisory Council recommended changes to statutes, rules, and policies.

Identify how data generated from vehicles and infrastructure can be used to improve safety and mobility, while addressing data privacy and security. *Meetings have been completed.*

Identify potential changes to insurance laws, how insurance may change for consumers, and liability. Sept. 24 at MnDOT District 6 Rochester Headquarter, 2900 48th Street NW, Rocheser MN 55901 from 1 -3:30 p.m.

Identify potential changes in traffic regulations to support these technologies, address safety, and identify risks and opportunities for law enforcement. *Sept. 20 at the Minnesota Safety Council, 474 Concordia Ave., St. Paul from 2-4 p.m.*

Identify opportunities to grow Minnesota businesses, jobs, and labor force, and identify the impact on Minnesota's workforce. *Sept. 18 at the Minnesota Department of Transportation's Central Office at 395 John Ireland Blvd, St. Paul from 10-12 p.m.*

Identify how this technology can be accessible and equitable for all Minnesotans, including rural communities, elderly Minnesotans, Minnesotans with disabilities, low-income communities, communities of color, and American Indians.
