## Civil Engineering Internship Program

The Civil Engineering Internship Program, offered in partnership by Center for Transportation Studies (CTS) and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT), is designed to provide an opportunity for undergraduate students majoring in Civil Engineering or Construction Engineering who are interested in transportation-related careers to gain real-world skills to complement their academic pursuits.



### Program at a Glance

- Interns are placed in offices, based on the office rankings they identified during the application process.
- Interns spend 10 weeks in paid positions gaining hands-on professional experience.
- Interns work full-time (40 hours a week) for the duration of the internship.
- Interns work on transportation-focused projects and are provided with mentoring, training, and development opportunities.
- Upon completion of the program, Interns may be eligible to become a college student worker or transfer into the Seeds student worker program.\*

*\*The Seeds program is a career track for college students who are minorities, economically disadvantaged, disabled or recently returned veterans.*

## Qualifications:

Applicant must be an undergraduate student currently pursuing a B.S. in civil engineering from the University of Minnesota.

Applicant must be legally eligible for employment in the United States. Proof of your eligibility to work in the United States will be required.

No prior transportation-related work experience is required.

Priority will be given to students completing their junior year, but sophomores may also apply.

Priority will be given to applicants with GPAs of 3.0 or better.

The program is open to all qualified applicants. Members of diverse groups are encouraged to apply.
