PRE-EMPLOYMENT SCREENING PROGRAM (PSP)

WHAT DRIVERS NEED TO KNOW

The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) helps motor carriers review drivers' crash and safety records as part of the hiring process. You can also review your personal PSP record at any time. PSP is a new Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) program. A PSP record includes five years of crash data and three years of roadside inspection data from the Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS) database.

HOW DOES PSP WORK?

- PSP is an easy-to-use online service for drivers to purchase their personal crash and safety history records
- The secure service confirms the user's identity before providing record access
- Your record is presented instantly on screen, and can be saved and printed

WHO CAN PURCHASE RECORDS?

- Drivers can purchase their own records at any time
- Motor carriers can purchase records as part of pre-employment screening, with the driver's written consent

WHAT YOU'LL NEED TO PURCHASE RECORDS:

- Your current driver's license number
- A credit card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express)
- A valid email address

A PSP record purchase costs \$10. This fee includes a search on a current commercial driver's license record, and/or any commercial driver's license you have held during the last five years.

You can view a record on screen, right away, and receive an email receipt.
