

Highway 4 – City of St. James

Project

Reconstruct Highway 4 from south of 10th Avenue South (CR 57) to 11th Avenue North in the City of St. James. Replace city utilities and provide ADA compliant sidewalks.

Benefits

- The project will improve roadway structure and smoothness through reconstruction. The original 1951 concrete rides rough with an extremely poor road condition rating.
- Upgrade city utility infrastructure, which is currently experiencing multiple breaks each winter.
- Decrease maintenance of roadway and utility structures.
- Reduce delays and improve safety with mini-roundabouts at Armstrong Blvd and 1st Ave intersections
- Add back-in angle parking downtown for maximum parking and safety
- Enhance pedestrian accommodations through sidewalk construction, boulevard aesthetics and safety.
- Continuous corridor lighting

Schedule

- July-Oct. 2016 Major construction on 8th Avenue North and Weston Ave.
- May-Oct. 2017 Major construction from 10th Avenue South to Weston Avenue (requires Hwy 4 detour)
- May-Sept. 2018 Major construction from Weston Avenue to 11th Avenue North (requires Hwy 4 detour)
- May-June, 2019 Finishing Work

Issues

- Deteriorating roadway structure and failing city infrastructure driving need for project
- Business access during construction
- Known contaminated soils
- Detour of Highway 4
- Loss of parking in downtown area
