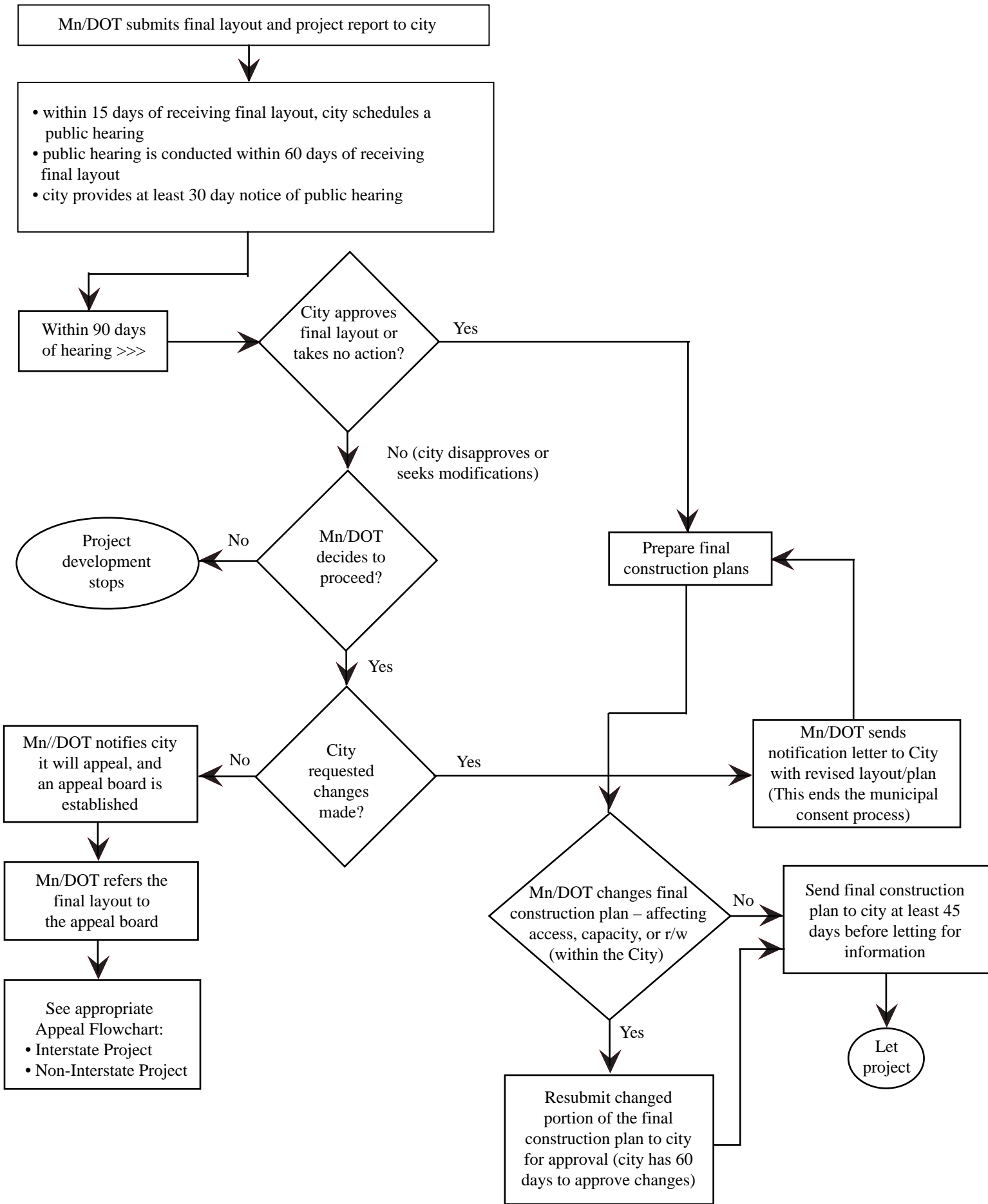


# Municipal Consent Process

(See Minnesota Statutes Sections 161.162 to 161.167)



Mn/DOT submits final layout and project report to city

- within 15 days of receiving final layout, city schedules a public hearing
- public hearing is conducted within 60 days of receiving final layout
- city provides at least 30 day notice of public hearing

Within 90 days of hearing >>>

City approves final layout or takes no action?

Yes

No (city disapproves or seeks modifications)

Project development stops

No

Mn/DOT decides to proceed?

Yes

Mn//DOT notifies city it will appeal, and an appeal board is established

No

City requested changes made?

Yes

Mn/DOT refers the final layout to the appeal board

• Interstate Project  
• Non-Interstate Project

Prepare final construction plans

Mn/DOT sends notification letter to City with revised layout/plan (This ends the municipal consent process)

Mn/DOT changes final construction plan – affecting access, capacity, or r/w (within the City)

Send final construction plan to city at least 45 days before letting for information

Let project

Resubmit changed portion of the final construction plan to city for approval (city has 60 days to approve changes)
