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1.0 SCOPE

SKID / COMPACT TRACK LOADERS and OEM ATTACHMENTS

This unit shall be the most current advertised production model as modified per specifications and approved by Mn/DOT. Unit to be furnished with all standard equipment advertised, whether or not specifically called for here, except where the item is replaced by optional over standard equipment, or conflicting equipment is specified. The unit shall be complete with all equipment required as listed below, and ready for immediate operation to function. Unit must meet applicable codes and standards.

2.0 SKID STEER REQUIREMENT

- 2.1 Unit shall have an operator cab with side screens, ROPS and FOPS.
- 2.2 Unit shall have seat belt and parking brake.
- 2.3 Unit shall have an interlock control system which requires operator to be seated, with the seat belt on or bar down and engine running before unit can be operated.
- 2.4 Unit must have a quick-change mechanism for mounting attachments.
- 2.5 Unit shall be equipped with audible backup alarm.
- 2.6 Unit shall have emergency escape rear window.
- 2.7 Manufacturers standard color acceptable, paint must be lead free.
- 2.8 The Contract Vendor shall give adequate instruction in mounting, removal, operation, safety and maintenance of supplied equipment before purchase will be considered complete.
- 2.9 The Responder shall supply pricing for one set of parts, service, repair and operation manuals for each make and model that is offered.
- 2.10 The Contract Vendor shall furnish a standard manufacturer's warranty. The Contract Vendor shall be responsible for the cost of any inspections, adjustments, parts, labor, travel, pickup and/or delivery charges that are a result of equipment failure(s) during the warranty period. This shall be performed without delay. This warranty shall commence when the unit is put into service. The Responder shall state warranty for all items requested on the pricing page.

3.0 OEM ATTACHMENT REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1 The Responder should supply pricing for one set of parts and service manuals for each OEM attachment they are offering.
- 3.2 The Contract Vendor shall give adequate instruction in mounting removal, operation, safety and maintenance of supplied OEM attachment before purchase will be considered complete.
- 3.3 All attachments must be able to be mounted on a quick change mechanism.
- 3.4 Manufacturers standard color acceptable, paint must be lead free.
- 3.5 Attachments must meet all current Federal and Minnesota safety codes.
- 3.6 When offering attachments, the price shall include everything needed so unit is complete, assembled, and ready to install for use by the operator from cab.
- 3.7 The Contract Vendor shall furnish a standard manufacturer's warranty. The Contract Vendor shall be responsible for the cost of any inspections, adjustments, parts, labor, travel, pickup and/or delivery charges that are a result of equipment failure(s) during the warranty period. This shall be performed without any delay. This warranty shall commence when the unit is put into service. The Responder shall state warranty for all attachments offered.
- 3.8 Attachments offered must directly attach to and be powered by skid steer.
- 3.9 Responders may not offer attachments without offering skid steers. Only OEM attachments will be considered if responder also offers pricing for skid steers. There is a separate contract for aftermarket attachments.
