NRRA Income

- States need to check on their commitments and payments See last quarterly report from the pooled fund website and work with Ben Worel and Lisa Jansen (SPR coordinator).
- Illinois Tollway (Partnership) and Iowa (SPR system) is in the process of joining NRRA.
- Associate membership (2K/year) is being used for NRRA activities and managed under a different MnDOT account.

Budget

- The budget was covered and the available funds remaining see the last quarterly report.
- Current available funds for the Call for Innovation is 450K without getting funding from the Illinois Tollway or Iowa. With these agencies funds 600K would be available.
- Only other non-committed funds going to NRRA efforts at this time is the HMA Performance Testing at 75K which will be discussed in the next Flexible team meeting in October.

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NRRA Call for Innovation (2019 funding discussion)

- 23 projects were submitted for funding consideration
- Each state reviewed the proposals individually by team according to the scoring system
 developed for the teams. These minimum proposal requirements and scoring systems were
 shared with all NRRA members to do their evaluations. NRRA thanks all groups for their
 participation in developing each proposal.
- These ratings/rankings were used to select the following projects to be funded using 450K. The ideas will go back to the teams in their October meeting to help define the tasks/goals to be developed into a contract.
