## **Tribal Road Signs**

Presented by Sue Groth, Lead, Tribal Road Signs Committee:

• Committee met on December 6, 2006 at St. Cloud

- Purpose of Meeting was to discuss assorted issues relative to placement of Boundary and other signage in or near reservations. To set in motion, development of a process for Tribal signing. Ultimately, a comprehensive plan
- Work on guidelines for tribal signing issues across state/county jurisdictions.
- A survey was sent to tribes to gain input about issues of concern with two tribes responding.(handout)
- Requested the ACTT to participate in reviewing the tribal input and to fit into Mn/DOT's current Guide & Service Sign Program – completed at meeting
- Discussion by ACTT
  - Installation and maintenance are issues to address
  - Dual language signs may also be considered
  - Of primary concern with tribes is the boundary and tribal government office signing.

**ACTION**: Tribal Road Sign will continue to meet to develop a process for tribal road signing. Next meeting is scheduled for January 22, 2007 10 AM at St. Cloud.

# 1. Look at Statewide Policy- No report/Group has not met

# 2. Identify & Promote Successful Practices Committee

Presented by Scott Hanson & Mike Moilanen, Co-Lead, Identify & Promote Successful Practices Committee:

(Handout from Scott Hansen-Mille Lacs Band)

- Example of an MOU between a band and state DOT or other agencies.
- Each tribe should determine how formal they want their relationship to be.
- Mille Lacs goal is to at least meet annually with Mn/DOT to talk about vegetation management issues.
- The key is the <u>cooperation</u> to jointly work out vegetation management issues. Share resources when appropriate (e.g. band may agree to do some mowing on TH R/W to help out).
- Some bands have very good working relationships already and may not need a formal MOU. (Good to customize locally.)
- This MOU would be an option to propose to MIAC (April meeting).
- Will send out an electronic copy of the sample MOU to members for review. Tribal Attorney may want to review. **ACTION**
- Education is likely part of any solution. People need to understand the effects of chemicals on the environment.
- Boise Forte would like to be a pilot on how to approach this. **ACTION**
- Red Lake applies and gets funding from Bureau of Land Management for fire

suppression to remove vegetation (i.e. fuel for fire). They use the money to mow the whole R/W way (some on TH R/W).

• Looking for best management practices (BMP's).

### **ACTION:**

- 1. Bois Forte and Mille Lacs volunteered to be the pilot project for drafting an MOU with their MNDOT regions and or State of MN. Due Dates?
- ML will put together draft MIAC resolution for discussion at next quarterly ACTT meeting – March 23, 2007

### 3. Create Awareness & Educate on Issues Report

Presented by Cheryl Cloud, Member, Create Awareness & Educate on Issues Subcommittee

- Cheryl has done research and also made contacts with MN Dept of Ag., Terry McDill
- DNR typically handles <u>established</u> species.
- MN Dept of Agriculture typically handles emerging species.
- Option: Develop a tool kit. Would contain educational materials. TTAP with a link to Minnesota would be a possibility.

#### **ACTION ITEM:**

- 1. Committee will continue to work on issue including toolbox on issue and possible speakers for MN Dept of Ag at future meetings/conferences
- 1. Mn/DOT Central Office (Paul Walvatne) leads meetings annually in each district to discuss vegetative management issues, as well as other issues. Suggested that Paul ask each district to contact appropriate tribal reps so they can attend these meetings. (These training sessions may include more than one Mn/DOT district.) Dan Gullickson will contact Paul on this.

### Mn/DOT's Functional Classification System Update:

Presentation by Theresa Chapman and Jim Garrigan (Handout - Teresa Chapman)

- Theresa briefly went over current progress of Functional Classification Update. There has not been much tribal discussion to date
- Jim Garrigan went over his involvement on committee
- Discussion centered on MNDOT recognition of BIA IRR Classifications
- How would we deal with grandfathered in IRR routes that were classified under to old system
- These routes may need to be updated before they would be recognized
- Tribes hope Mn/DOT would accept the new BIA classification system in terms of routes qualifying for ATP funding. (Needs to be a major collector or higher for ATP funding.)
- Work should be ready to report back at our fall meeting.
- Goal is to include all IRR routes in the Mn/DOT functional classification system.
