Reports from Subcommittees:

<u>Tribal Road Sign Committee – 1/19/07 Action Item</u>
<u>1. Look at Statewide Policy</u>

Presented by Linda Aitken, Tribal Road Signs Committee:

- Committee met on March 15, 2006 at St. Cloud
- Work on guidelines for tribal signing issues across state/county jurisdictions using Mn/DOT's "Managing Traffic in Minnesota" brochure as a model. The Tribal Road Signs committee will bring a draft Tribal Road Signs proposal to ACTT at a future meeting.

Discussion:

- Leech Lake has many reservation boundary signs on hand that should be installed.
- MIAC and Mn/DOT have agreed on the standard sign format for casinos this will be included in the tribal signs brochure.
- Leech Lake is looking for more control over what signing is allowable on the reservation. This is moving forward on trunk highways and to some extent on county roads.
- Should the standard include the tribal roads that would show the BIA route number? The policy could present a standard size, shape, legend, size, etc. The actual use of those signs would be up to the individual tribes.
- Should there be a policy on using a sign to indicate the motorist is leaving a reservation
- Question: Will this TRS policy apply to the counties? No, counties have their own road sign policies, but they do look to Mn/DOT for guidance.
- Dave E. would like a list of each county that includes a reservation. He would take the signing proposal to those counties for their review. Mn/DOT's State Aid Office should also be brought into this discussion.

ACTION: Tribal Road Sign will continue to meet to develop a brochure & process for tribal road signing and will report back next ACTT meeting. Next TRS meeting is scheduled for April 16, 2007 1:15 PM at Wilmar.

Roadside Vegetation Management – 1/19/07 Action Items

- 1. Update: Bois Forte and Mille Lacs MOU Pilot Project
 - Carl D. has a meeting set up (April 5th) with District 1 maintenance staff to address this topic. Some draft MOU's are being reviewed. The pilot project will result in a workable MOU between Bois Forte and Mn/DOT.
 - Scott H. is also interested in developing a vegetative management plan with Mn/DOT.
 - Bonnie Harper-Lowe has an MOU from NY State that works well and she'll forward to ACTT.

2. Draft MIAC resolution

- Scott Hanson, Mille Lacs, handed out a draft resolution for MIAC support to developing integrated vegetative management plans.
- 3. Create Awareness & Educate Committee report on toolbox issue and possible speakers for MN Dept of Ag

- Status report from Cheryl Martin, TTAP (not able to attend because of schedule conflict)
 - ◆ Roadside Vegetation Toolbox Cheryl has assigned this task to TTAP staff & they are gathering material for it from other federal agencies (Department of Agriculture, DNR, etc.)

TTAP can post things as the committee such as minutes, tools, resources, contacts, discussion forums, etc. Cheryl requests feedback from ACTT regarding utilization of TTAP website.
