Truck Traffic Trends

The most significant corridors in Central Minnesota are I-94, US 10, and the US 169 corridor.

Additional routes: TH 24 connector (I-94 – US 10), US 71, MN 371, and MN 23





Rail Traffic Trends – Projection 2030

BNSF annual volumes mainline between Mpls and Fargo, currently the highest volume line in Minnesota.

CP's mainline between Minneapolis and North Dakota is forecast to increase 14 to 18 million tons





Issues

- Lack of coordination in transportation planning, zoning, land use.
 - City, County, Joint District, Mn/DOT
 - Incorporation economic and industrial development





Issues

Urban Freight mobility in St. Cloud, Brainerd, Aitkin, etc., particularly on IRC

- Bottlenecks
- Congestions
- Parking

Congested connections to TCMA limit access to larger markets

- I-94 Corridor
- Connector routes TH – 24 & TH 25





Issues

Address Commuter Rail and Freight Rail Issues in Becker/Big Lake/St. Cloud

St. Cloud Airport impact

- Re-establishing passenger service





Issues

Freight rail policy and improve coordination

- Communication between agencies, zoning and regulations
- Grade crossing and intersection design policy
- Revise grade crossing and separation policies
- Rail infrastructure in industrial development sites - spurs





Possible Recommendations

- Establish a Regional Freight Advisory Committee
- Designate a tiered truck network
- Designate Super Haul Corridors for Permit Operations
- Support restoring Commercial Passenger/Air Cargo at the St. Cloud Airport
- Develop Freight Rail/Highway Policies
- Address bottlenecks on TH 23, TH 210, TH 10
- Address turning radius TH 210 and US 169 Interchange
- Study Freight Impact on TH 24 Connector (I-94 to TH 10)
- Undertake Quick Start Projects (less than \$50,000)
