Notice the low interst in eating and picnic table use on I 35 compared to I 94. Forest Lake especially having low use. Possibly telling us that a great need for immediate picnic tables doesn't exist in our inbound information centers and rest areas.

For the year of 1971 our rest area surveys have indicated a reduction in persons per vehicle to 2.9. Our present figure of 3.3 per vehicle was established from our 1969 Lake Hansel Study of August 1969. Our 1971 surveys were held at General Andrews, Forest Lake, Dresbach, Burgen Lake, Lake Latoka, Adrian East and West bound, Kettle River and Stewartville. Our 1970 studies at Moorhead, Lake Iverson and Lake Latoka indicated an average of 3.2 persons per vehicle. You'll notice the decrease in persons per vehicle from 3.3 in 1969 to 2.9 in 1971. This reduction could make a difference in the size of our facilities of our future rest areas.
