Results of T.H. 61 Rest Area Survey - 1975

Mt. Josephine Rest Area Knife River Rest Area

During August, 1976 two usage surveys were made at the Mt. Josephine and Knife River Rest Areas on T.H. 61 in District 1. These surveys were taken to gain information and insight as to the motorists user habits of these upgraded rest area sites and the recreational activities along the north shore of Lake Superior. The information gained from these surveys will be compared to other highway system rest area usage and used to develop appropriate design parameters for future rest area developed along T.H. 61.

In addition to the usage surveyed at the Department's rest area facilities, additional information was gathered concerning usage of state parks and other recreational facilities (see page 3) at the request of DNR. The results are interesting, indicating that highway rest areas appear to be used at a comparable level as state parks, considering total usage of TH 61.

The usage surveys for the (2) rest areas reveal interesting and very diverse user patterns. Comments highlighting those user patterns are as follows:

MT. JOSEPHINE REST AREA - Class II, vault type restroom

- . Lower mainline traffic volumes, related to remote location.
- . Higher percentage of vehicles stopping related to higher concentration of tourist traffic. Mt. Josephine located at Canadian border, well into the tourist travel zone of North Shore.
- . Higher incidence of vehicles stopping, also related to sites proximity to urban area.
- . Average length of stay lower-related to limited facilities and scenic view.
- . Purpose for entering was for scenic view, main activity of rest area. Main purpose for entering most rest areas is to use restrooms.

- . Higher use of travel information facilities related to the sites location within the tourist travel zone.
- . Traffic flow in N.B. direction, reflecting directional tourist travel higher percent stopping on N. B. lane

KNIFE RIVER REST AREA - Class II, vault type restroom

- . Higher mainline traffic volumes, related to proximity to Duluth, Two Harbors and commuter traffic.
- . Lower percentage of vehicles stopping related to urban local and commuter traffic.
- . Average length of stay about average related to facilities and activities available.
- . Purpose for entering, restrooms, similar to most rest area survey information.
- . Travel information facilities used more due to entering the heavy tourist travel zone of North Shore.

The rest area usage information, coupled with the "system analysis" of T.H. 61 from Duluth to the Canadian border will provide use with the appropriate information to determine the rest area development requirements of the North Shore, the level of service and the design criteria needed in the development.
