Straight River Rest Areas Usage Study 135

The two rest areas, south bound and north bound, were studied to obtain current use information. This information will be used in providing the proper numbers of facilities at new areas and to check if use patterns are changing.

Questions that were asked of these people stopping in the rest area included questions about current vacations and the gas shortage. The answers to these should show changes in travel patterns since the gas shortage.

The information is obtained by giving each vehicle entering the rest area a questioneer which is answered during their stay in the area. The questioneer is then collected as the vehicle leaves the area. The study is performed for 5 consecutive days Thursday - Monday 8 hours per day.

The mainline traffic is counted and classified according to type of vembicle during the same period of time. This allows us to derive averages for stopping and length of stay for each type vehicle using the rest area.
