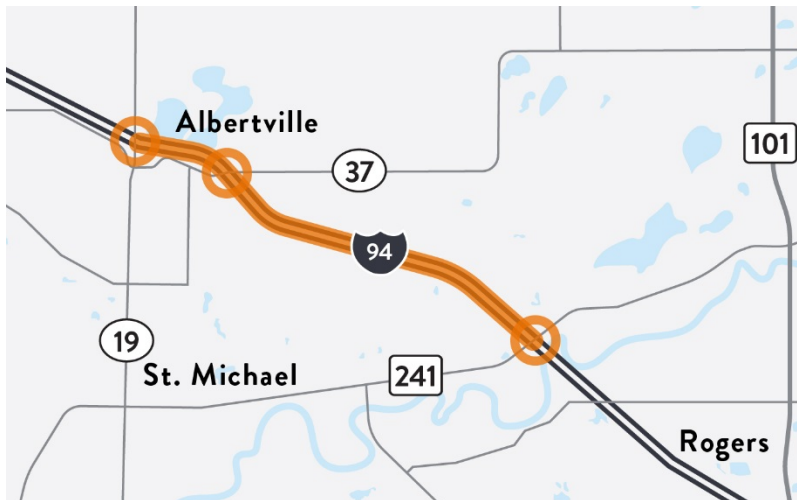


Highway 94 – St Michael to Albertville

This project will expand Interstate 94 from four to six lanes in between Highway 241 in St Michael and County Road 19 in Albertville. The proposed project is envisioned to not only improve the capacity of the interstate by adding a third lane in each direction there will be interchange improvements at Highway 241 and at County Roads 37 and 19 in Albertville. The project will reduce travel delay by more than 330 hours per day, eliminate slightly less than \$1.0 million in crash costs annually, and make trips on the corridor much more reliable.



Project Facts:

- Project awarded \$56 Million (10% reduction due to projected efficiencies found during project development)
- Builds auxiliary lanes between St Michael and Albertville (adds a 3rd lane)
- Improves access at three interchanges

Submittal and scoring

The project was submitted by several people including Steve Bot (St Michael City Engineer), Adam Flaherty (Otsego City Administrator), and Adam Nafstad (Albertville City Administrator). Their submission included “4 to 6 lane expansion and reconstruction/completion of interchanges at TH (trunk highway) 241 and CSAH (county state aid highway) 37/19.”

Scoring Information

As directed by the 2017 Legislation MnDOT scored projects on Return on Investment, Economic Impact, Freight Efficiency, Safety Improvements, Regional Connections, Policy Objectives, Community Consensus, and Regional Balance.

This project was the second highest scoring Greater Minnesota project with a score of 580.
