

DRIVER'S LICENSE GENERAL INFORMATION

A Valid Driver's License is Required for Drivers to Provide Service

What class of driver's license is needed?

In Minnesota, there are four classes of driver's licenses, Class A through Class D. The most common is Class D, a non-commercial driver's license that is required to operate a vehicle weighing 26,000 pounds or less.

Summary of driver's license classifications:

Class A - required to drive any vehicle towing a unit of more than 10,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight Rating with a gross combination weight rating (truck plus trailer) over 26,000 pounds. Class A is a commercial driver's license.

Class B - required to drive any single-unit vehicle that is over 26,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight Rating. Class B is a commercial driver's license.

Class C - required to drive a vehicle designed to transport 16 or more passengers, including the driver. This is a commercial driver's license.

Class D - required to operate a vehicle weighing 26,000 pounds or less. This is a non-commercial driver's license.
