

SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LIMOUSINE PERMITS

Your business may be subject to enforcement actions if you do not comply with Minnesota rules and regulations. The commissioner of transportation is authorized to suspend or revoke your operating permit for an indefinite period of time when operators are not in compliance as noted below.

MN Rules 8880.1300 SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF PERMIT

Your permit may be suspended for:

- Failure to maintain insurance,
- Willfully refusing to allow an inspection,
- Failure to pay a fine.

Your permit may be revoked if you:

- Knowingly made a false or misleading statement in a permit application.
- Provided limousine service when the operator's permit was suspended,
- Did not have a permit, that was indefinitely suspended, restored within 60 days of suspension, or did not demand a hearing.

The commissioner shall mail notice of suspension or revocation of a permit by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the last known address of the limousine operator. The suspension or revocation is effective five days after it is mailed by the commissioner.

There is a hearing process that is detailed in MN Rules 8880.1300.

PLEASE NOTE: A revoked permit may not be reinstated. The holder of a revoked permit may not apply for a new permit for one year from the effective date of revocation.
