

VOLUNTARY SURRENDER INFORMATION

What is a Voluntary Surrender?

A voluntary surrender allows a limousine operator to voluntarily cancel their permit to avoid suspension or cancellation by MnDOT of their limousine service permit.

When do providers need a Voluntary Surrender?

Limousine operators may need to temporarily suspend their business operation for a period of time due to circumstances such as extended travel, inability to maintain insurance coverage or other operational issues. In such cases they would notify MnDOT by submitting a Voluntary Surrender. This would relieve the limousine operator of their statutory obligations.

How long does it last?

It is in effect up to one year. After one year, operator must reapply and pay application fee.

Can a limo operator provide services while a Voluntary Surrender is in effect?

No. A provider must have a current limousine service permit on file to be able to provide limousine services.

Will the vehicle(s) need to be inspected when the provider reapplies for a certificate of compliance?

Inspection dates are determined by the date on the limousine identification decal.
