MnDOT asked those who use London Road/Hwy 61 to respond to a quick survey, asking what concerns they have along the corridor from 26th Avenue East to 60th Avenue East.

- Postcards to everyone within a one-block radius of the corridor
- Paid Facebook ad targeting people in the Duluth and surrounding area

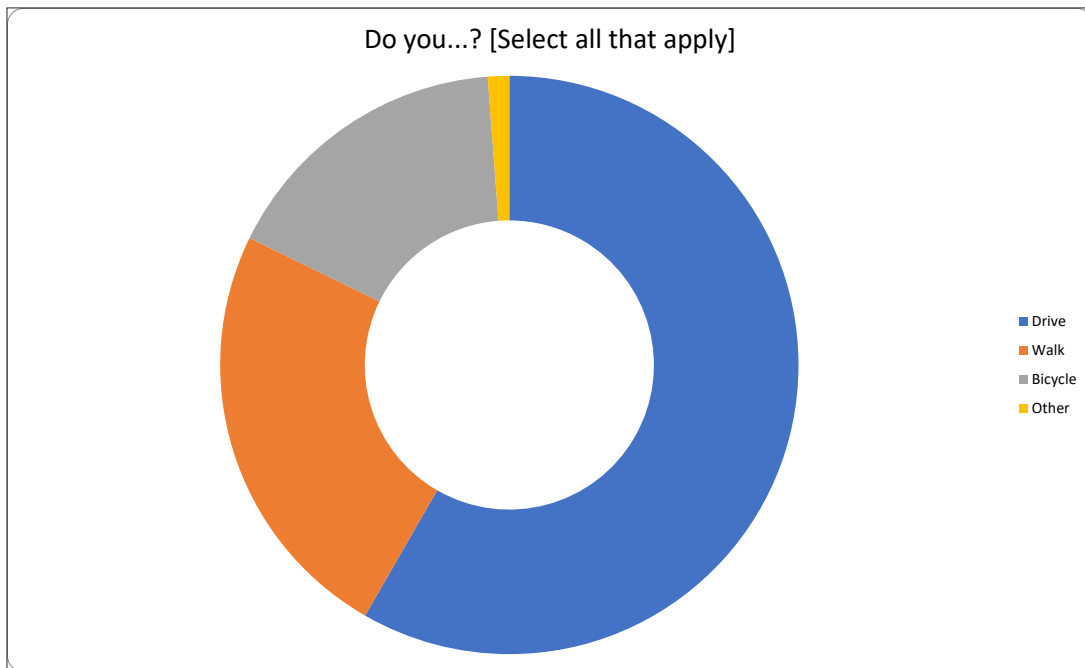
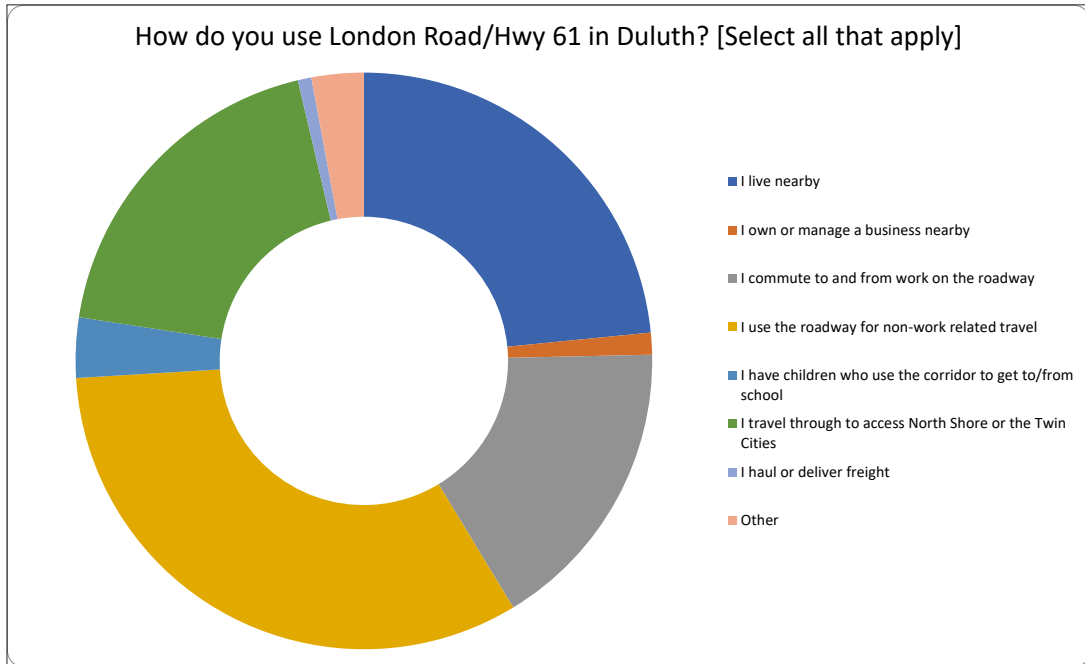


We had more than 2,200 responses.

### Most noted concerns on London Road corridor

- Vehicles move too fast and do not obey speed limit
- Vehicles move too slow, insufficient traffic flow
- Pedestrian crossing of London Road very difficult and unsafe
- Drainage problems in southbound right lane west of 40th Avenue East
- Speeding vehicles northbound from 26th Avenue East at merge
- Traffic delays and safety concerns due to lack of northbound left turn lanes from 40th to 60th Avenue East
- Vehicles passing in parking lanes
- Difficult for vehicles turning left onto London Road and pedestrian crossing unsafe at 60th Avenue East
- Traffic backups at 40th Avenue East signal
- Difficult for vehicles turning left out of Chateau Apartments and Glensheen
- Difficultly for vehicles turning left from 32nd and 36th avenues
- Vehicles parked too close to intersections obstructing view

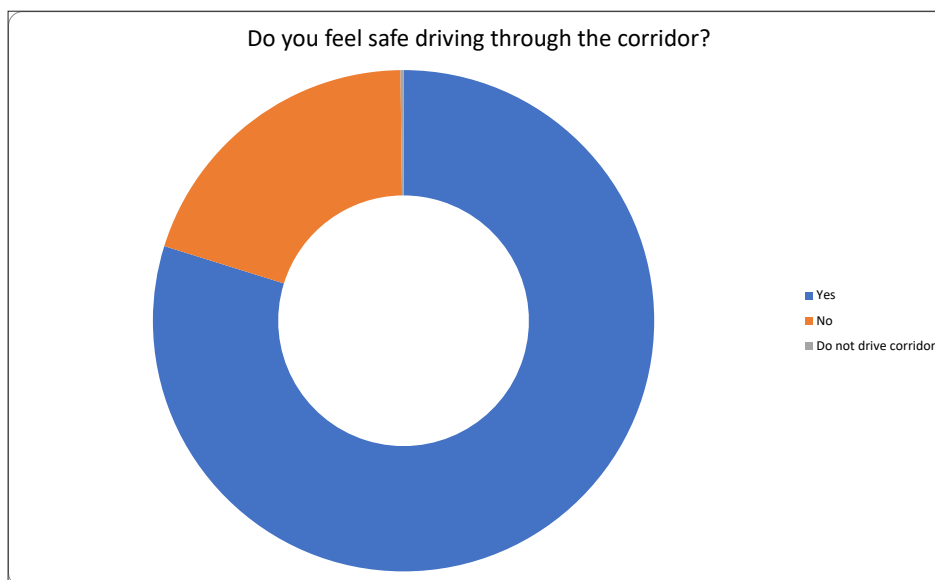
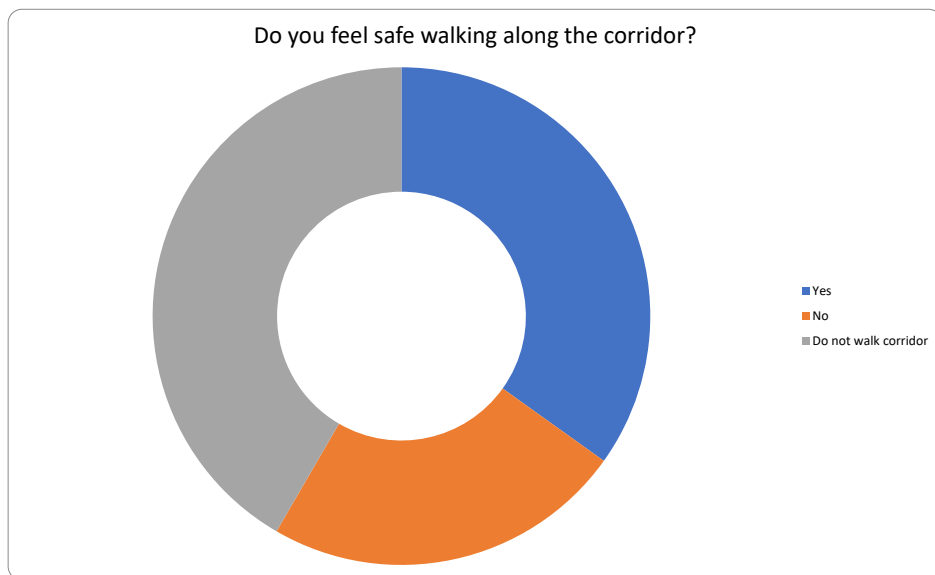
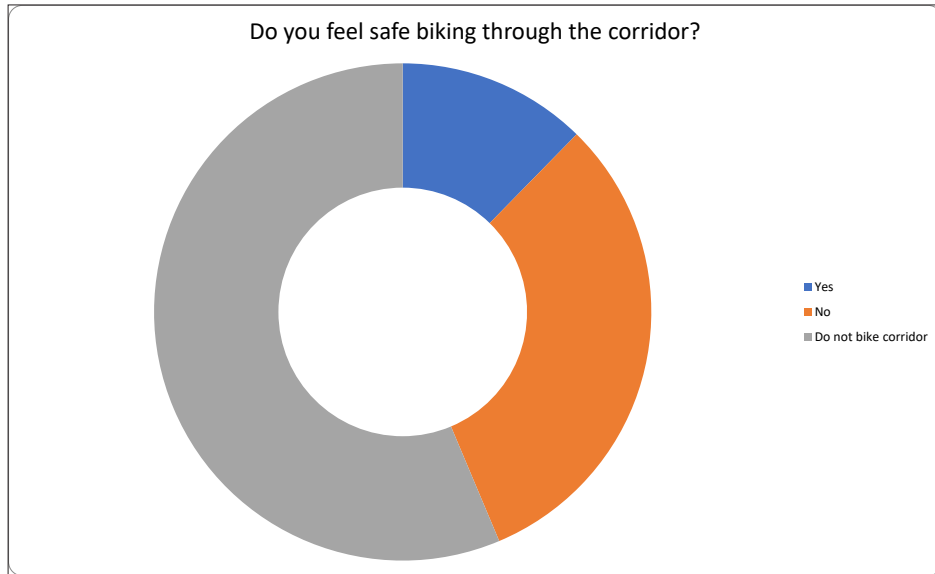

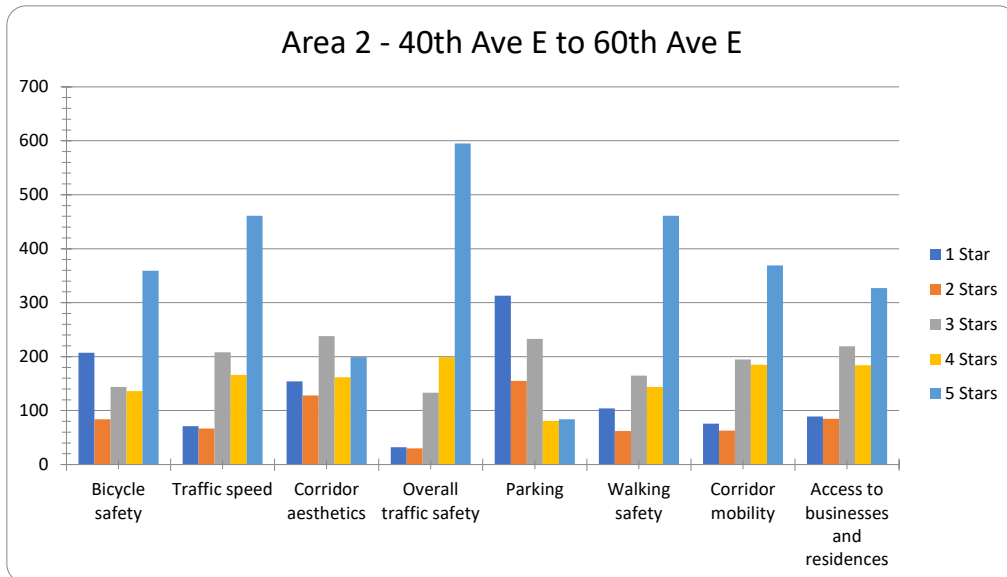

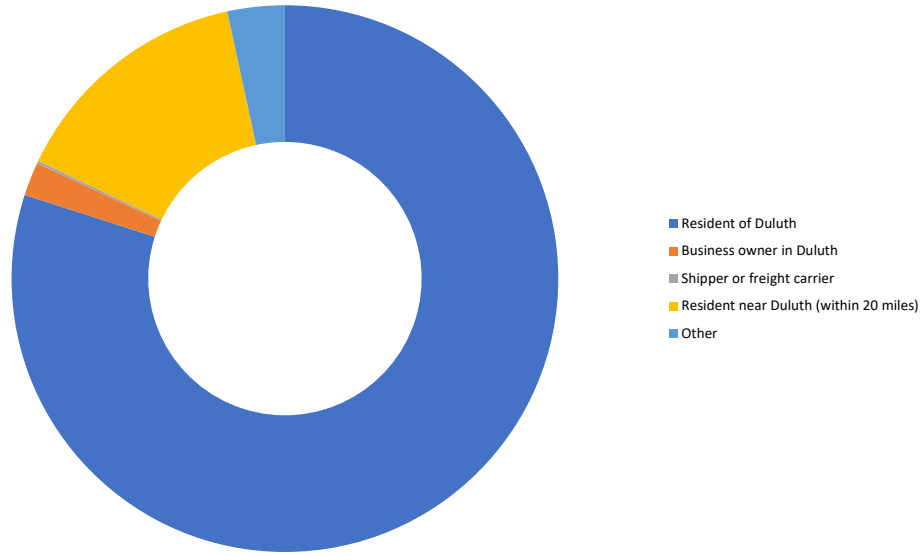
