- 1. Works with plants and trees along highways and waterways
- 2. Maintains and builds MnDOT traffic signals
- 3. Does heavy manual labor, often outside, like cutting grass, removing snow, repairing equipment
- 4. Plans transportation systems to meet the needs of all users
- 5. Provides information and services to external customers
- 6. Specializes in electrical wiring of traffic lights, lighting and other statewide systems
- 7. Diagnose, repair and maintain all types of heavy equipment like snow plows or trucks for MnDOT
- 8. Works with metal to design and build pieces for plows, wings, trucks, trailers, mowers and more.
- 9. Designs and builds complex products, machines, systems or structures
- 10. Takes and edits photos of MnDOT projects and other photography needs
- 11. Flies airplanes for MnDOT
- 12. Plans, implements, investigates and evaluates safety programs for MnDOT
- 13. Effectively communicates messages internally and externally
- 14. Drafts, reviews and approves structural plans and architectural drawings
- 15. Tracks money and prepares financial statements for MnDOT
- 16. Determines the position of points and the distances between them to establish land boundaries
- 17. Provides expertise regarding water resources, and soil and groundwater contamination
- 18. Designs publications, web graphics and other marketing materials
- 19. Helps keep the freeways safe and clean, and provides help to stranded motorists
- 20. Design attractive and functional public spaces with buildings, roads, walkways, flowers, shrubs and trees



MnDOT maintains 11,733 miles of roads and owns 4,389 bridges. The tallest bridge above water in the state is in Virginia, MN and is 194 feet high. The State of Minnesota did not begin building roads and bridges until after the State Highway Commission was created in 1905. Before that, roads were built by the military, townships or individual people.






8 FAST FACTS

Check for Safety



Safety is a core value! The Minnesota Department of Transportation works hard to keep employees and the public safe during construction. Can you spot five different unsafe practices in this construction site?



Safety is essential for all construction projects. Common safety checks include:

- · All workerswearing a hard hat or other protective gear
- · All pedestrians obeying the posted safety signs and barricades
- · All people paying attention and keeping a distraction-free construction zone
- Removing any standing water to avoid slips and accidents
- · Avoiding standing in the path of any heavy equipment
- · Boards or loose materials that could be tripped on
- · Using safe bridges and guardrails




